



HEALTH REQUIREMENTS For All New Students 2019-2020

New students must comply with California Department of Public Health and Diocese of Oakland School Dept. regulations prior to entry. Please submit all documentation to the school office by, **July 2, 2019**.

No student will be allowed entry without immunization requirements, TB risk assessment signed by the physician, and TB documentation if >1 risk factor.

TK and Kindergarten:

- A complete physical exam dated within 6 months of entry (on or after March 1, 2019) Use the form provided or submit a detailed health exam from the physician, such as Kaiser's form. If your child has a physical scheduled after July 2, please contact the office.
- Required immunization records. (see Parents Guide to Immunizations Required for School Entry)
- Verification of a dental visit (dental form, letter, or invoice that includes name of student, dentist, and dentist address)
- Tuberculosis (TB) Screening within 6 months of entry (on or after March 1, 2019)
 - **A TB risk assessment performed within 6 months of entry is mandatory for TK/Kindergarten students. All new students must submit the risk assessment form signed by the physician.**
 - **If >1 risk factor present, please also present the result of the PPD/Mantoux skin test," a physician's statement of "negative symptom screening," or Physician's statement of "no risk."**

Grades 1-7:

- A complete physical exam dated within 18 months of entry. Use the form provided or submit a detailed health exam from the physician, such as Kaiser's form
- Required immunization records. (see Parents Guide to Immunizations Required for School Entry)
- Verification of a dental visit (dental form, letter, or invoice that includes name of student, dentist, and dentist address)
- Tuberculosis (TB) Screening within 2 years of entry.
 - **A TB risk assessment performed within 2 years of entry is mandatory for Gr. 1-7 students. All new students must submit the risk assessment form signed by the physician.**
 - **If >1 risk factor present, please also present the result of the PPD/Mantoux skin test," a physician's statement of "negative symptom screening," or Physician's statement of "no risk."**

Other

Care Plan for Children with Special Needs If your child has a serious or chronic health condition (i.e. asthma, allergies, diabetes, seizures, etc.) please obtain a form from the school office or website. This form is for medication to be kept in the office or self administered during school hours and must be signed by the physician. The school office will accept other care plans, such as those from Kaiser.

Permission to Carry and Self Medicate This form is optional and only required if your child's well-being is seriously in jeopardy without the inhaler/medication/epi-pen carried on his/her person, and you wish your child to carry their medication and self medicate. **The Care plan for Children with Special Needs must accompany this form.**
